## **MAGNIFICAT AND NUNC DIMITTIS IN A of 1911**

A Radio Three Choral Evensong broadcast in 2007 from his Cambridge *alma mater* – Clare College – highlighted the inspiration and sheer romanticism of this expansive and expressive setting.

Only in recent years has the quality of Browne's output come to prominence – one of his fine songs, *To Gratiana dancing and singing*, has achieved widespread performance and recording. Professor Edward Dent asserted that Browne to be "by far the cleverest of the musicians then at the University".

Browne claims a place in history as being a close friend of poet Rupert Brooke and was with him when he died. Browne's own death in the Summer of 1915 was widely deplored.


The *Magnificat and Nunc dimittis* edited by Richard Lyne is now available as CMS Reprint No 133.
