
Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time (B)

- 1. Happy the man whose offence <u>is</u> forgiv'n, whose sin <u>is</u> remitted.

 O happy the man to whom the Lord im<u>putes</u> no guilt, in whose spirit <u>is</u> no guile. *R*
- 2. But now I have acknowledged my sins; my guilt I did not hide.
 I said: 'I will confess my offence to the Lord.'
 And you, Lord, have forgiv'n the guilt of my sin. R
- 3. Rejoice, rejoice <u>in</u> the Lord, ex<u>ult</u> you just!
 O come, ring <u>out</u> your joy, all you up<u>right</u> of heart. *R*

The refrain is heard three times at the start: first played on the organ, then sung by the cantor, and then sung by all; it is then repeated by all after each verse.
