- 1. When I call, answer me, O <u>God</u> of justice; from anguish you released me, have mer<u>cy</u> and hear me! It is the Lord who grants favours to those <u>whom</u> he loves; the Lord hears me whenever I call him. *R*
- 2. 'What can bring us happiness?' <u>many</u> say. Lift up the light of your face on <u>us</u>, O Lord. I will lie in peace and sleep <u>comes</u> at once, for you alone, Lord, make me <u>dwell</u> in safety. *R*

The refrain is heard three times at the start: first played on the organ, then sung by the cantor, and then sung by all; it is then repeated by all after each verse.
