
Fourth Sunday of Easter (B)

1. Give thanks to the Lord for he is good; for his love <u>has</u> no end. It is better to take refuge in the Lord than to <u>trust</u> in men: It is better to take refuge <u>in</u> the Lord than to <u>trust</u> in princes. R

2. I will thank you for you have given answer and you <u>are</u> my Saviour. The stone which the builders rejected has become the <u>cornerstone</u>. This is the work <u>of</u> the Lord, a marvel <u>in</u> our eyes. R

3. Blessed in the name of the Lord is <u>he</u> who comes.
We bless you from the house <u>of</u> the Lord;
I will thank you for you have given answer and you <u>are</u> my Saviour.
Give thanks to the Lord for he is good; for his love <u>has</u> no end. *R*

The refrain is heard three times at the start: first played on the organ, then sung by the cantor, and then sung by all; it is then repeated by all after each verse.
