
## 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time (B)

Psalm 91, vv 2-3, 13-16; refrain v 2

1. It is good to give thanks <u>to</u> the Lord to make music to your name, <u>O</u> Most High; to proclaim your love <u>in</u> the morning and your truth in the watches <u>of</u> the night.

2. The just will flourish <u>like</u> the palmtree and grow like a Le<u>ba</u>non cedar.

3. Planted in the house of the Lord they will flourish in the courts <u>of</u> our God, still bearing fruit when they are old, still full of <u>sap</u>, still green, to proclaim that the <u>Lord</u> is just. In him, my rock, there <u>is</u> no wrong.

The refrain is heard three times at the start: first played on the organ, then sung by the cantor, and then sung by all; it is then repeated by all after each verse.
