
13th Sunday in Ordinary Time (B)

- 1. I will praise you, Lord, <u>you</u> have rescued me and have not let my enemies rejoice <u>o</u>ver me. O Lord, you have raised my soul <u>from</u> the dead, restored me to life from those who sink into the grave. **R**
- 2. Sing psalms to the Lord, <u>you</u> who love him, give thanks to his <u>ho</u>ly name.

 His anger lasts but a moment; his fa<u>vour</u> through life.

 At night there were tears, but joy <u>comes</u> with dawn. *R*
- 3. The Lord listened <u>and</u> had pity.
 The Lord came <u>to</u> my help.
 For me you have changed my mourning <u>in</u>to dancing,
 O Lord my God, I thank you for ever. *R*

The refrain is heard three times at the start: first played on the organ, then sung by the cantor, and then sung by all; it is then repeated by all after each verse.
