- 1. The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing <u>I</u> shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives <u>me</u> repose. Near restful wa<u>ters</u> he leads me, to revive my <u>drooping</u> spirit. *R*
- 2. He guides me along the right path; he is true <u>to</u> his name. If I should walk in the valley of darkness, no evil <u>would</u> I fear. You are there with your crook <u>and</u> your staff; with these you give me comfort. **R**
- 3. You have prepared a banquet for me in the sight of my foes.

  My head you have anointed with oil; my cup is overflowing. *R*
- 4. Surely goodness and kind<u>ness</u> shall follow me all the days <u>of</u> my life. In the Lord's own house <u>shall</u> I dwell for ever and ever. *R*

The refrain is heard three times at the start: first played on the organ, then sung by the cantor, and then sung by all; it is then repeated by all after each verse.
