
21st Sunday in Ordinary Time (B)

Psalm 33, vv 2-3, 16-23; refrain v 8

- 1. I will bless the Lord <u>at</u> all times, his praise always <u>on</u> my lips; in the Lord my soul shall <u>make</u> its boast. The humble shall hear and be glad. *R*
- 2. The Lord turns his face against the wicked to destroy their remembrance <u>from</u> the earth. The Lord turns his eyes <u>to</u> the just and his ears to their appeal. *R*
- 3. They call and the <u>Lord</u> hears and rescues them in all <u>their</u> distress. The Lord is close to the <u>broken-hearted</u>; those whose spirit is crushed <u>he</u> will save. *R*

- 4. Many are the trials of the just man but from them all the Lord will rescue him. He will keep guard over all his bones, not one of his bones shall be broken. *R*
- 5. Evil brings death <u>to</u> the wicked; those who hate the <u>good</u> are doomed.

 The Lord ransoms the souls <u>of</u> his servants.

 Those who hide in him shall not be condemned. *R*

The refrain is heard three times at the start: first played on the organ, then sung by the cantor, and then sung by all; it is then repeated by all after each verse.
