
## 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time (B)

Psalm 18, vv 8, 10, 12-14; refrain v 9

- 1. The law of the <u>Lord</u> is perfect, it re<u>vives</u> the soul.

  The rule of the Lord is <u>to</u> be trusted, it gives wisdom <u>to</u> the simple. *R*
- 2. The fear of the <u>Lord</u> is holy, abiding for ever.
  The decrees of the <u>Lord</u> are truth and all <u>of</u> them just. *R*
- 3. So in them your servant <u>finds</u> instruction; great reward is <u>in</u> their keeping. But who can detect <u>all</u> his errors? From hidden <u>faults</u> acquit me. *R*
- 4. From presumption restrain your servant and let it not rule me. Then shall I be blameless, clean from grave sin. *R*

The refrain is heard three times at the start: first played on the organ, then sung by the cantor, and then sung by all; it is then repeated by all after each verse.
